HURRICANE RECOVERY UPDATE

The latest information available as of 10:30 a.m., Saturday, 9/27/08:

NEWS, ETC.

- Hunters Creek Elementary has had power restored and plans full operation on Monday.
- Third Request of neighborhood leadership – please disseminate these current newsletter updates throughout your neighborhoods.

POWER

- CP reports that this morning they have redeployed crews and equipment from Sugarland to Hunters Creek. There are 320 linemen and 426 tree cutters in Hunters Creek presently (a 25% increase from yesterday).
- CP now estimates that over 90% of our households will have power “access” by Sunday evening. This means that power will be available to each residence at the service pole. If you sustained damage to your “drop line”, the wire from the pole to your home, repair to that segment will be your responsibility. If damage is evident, you should contact an electrician.
- CP has supervisory level representatives throughout the City. I am not sure how to identify them, but they are available to receive your questions. Please do not

approach the crews. They cannot answer your questions and will be impeded from completing their work.

- CP will need to gain access to rear yards. If you are home, they will knock on your front door. If no one is home, they will enter the rear yard. Please cooperate fully with them.
- On Monday, assuming that CP reaches its goal of near 100% power restoration by tomorrow, CP will begin a sweep of the City to trouble shoot individual property problems.

DEBRIS

- The City has contracted with VF Disposal to begin picking up bagged vegetation on Wednesday, 10/1. However, their equipment and personnel resources are limited at that time. So, bags will be retrieved, albeit slowly and methodically, over the next 10 days.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- CP suggests that everyone turn their A/C breakers OFF. This may be accomplished at the outside units where you should find a lever marked ON/OFF. Also, turn your major appliances OFF by either flipping the fuse breaker or pulling the plug. When power is restored to your home, slowly power up the equipment that has been turned off.
- Also, make sure electric range burners are TURNED OFF.
- Refer “special needs” homes/citizens to City Hall (older residents, invalids, etc.). We have a direct contact at CP who will respond, assess and react.
