CRIME PREVENTION TIP

Most criminals think that residents leave and go to work for the day only to return home later in the day. As you leave every day for work, be observant about the people in your neighborhood. If there is a vehicle parked along your street that seems suspicious, please call the police immediately. Most criminals like to check the area before they commit any crimes. I am not saying that this has happened in any or all of the recent cases, but it is a known fact.

Also, make sure that you pick up any newspapers or have the delivery stopped if you are travelling. If you see a couple of papers in your neighbors drive, please pick them up and let them know about the recent crime trend. Burglars assume that if there are two papers in the driveway then no one has been home for two days.

Just remember, if you think something looks out of place to you, then it probably is out of place. Residents know their neighborhoods and a majority of the time know who belong there.
