On June 13th at approximately 2:30 p.m. officers responded to a report of a burglary in progress on Hedwig Shadows. Upon arrival the officers found that the front door glass was broken and jewelry had been taken from the residence. The suspects were not located but they are described as;

The driver was described as having dark skin.

The vehicle was described as an older model dark green Ford Explorer with dark tinted windows. There was no license plate on the rear and one on the front dashboard.

## CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

The crime prevention tips for this week deal with the crimes of vehicle theft and thefts from vehicles. These types of crimes occur frequently in the Houston metro area and can many times be easily prevented by following the prevention tips listed below.

Vehicle Theft Prevention

NEVER leave your keys in an unoccupied vehicle even for a short period of time, and ALWAYS lock your vehicle and set the alarm system when it is unoccupied.

Theft from Vehicles

ALWAYS lock your vehicle when it is unoccupied, even when it is parked in your driveway.

ALWAYS set the alarm system if your vehicle is equipped with one, even when it is parked in your driveway.

NEVER leave valuables visible in the interior of your vehicle. Lock them in your trunk, glove box or console it possible or conceal them in some manner to keep them from being seen from outside of the vehicle. It is best to take all the valuables with you, especially PURSES and electronics such as cameras, iPods, laptop computers and phones.
